Read the bible & discuss:

Older kids read Exodus 3:1-22

1. What is God's plan to rescue his people? (v. 1-10)
2. How does Moses feel being a part of this plan? (v.11, 13, cf. 4:1, 10, 5:22, 6:30)
3. What is God's response to him? (v. 12, 14-21)
4. Read John 10:11-18. How is Jesus a different saviour in God's plan compared to Moses in this story?
5. How has this grown your appreciation for Jesus as our Saviour and Leader?
6. Name someone in your life who does not yet know Jesus. How does this story grow your confidence in sharing the good news of Jesus with them?

Younger kids talk discussion questions

1. When have you felt weak or worried about something?
2. How does Moses feel about being included in God's plan to rescue his people?
3. How does God show that Moses can trust Him in this story?
4. Why as Christians can we even more than Moses, truly trust that God is going to be always with us?
5. What is one thing you would like to pray for?

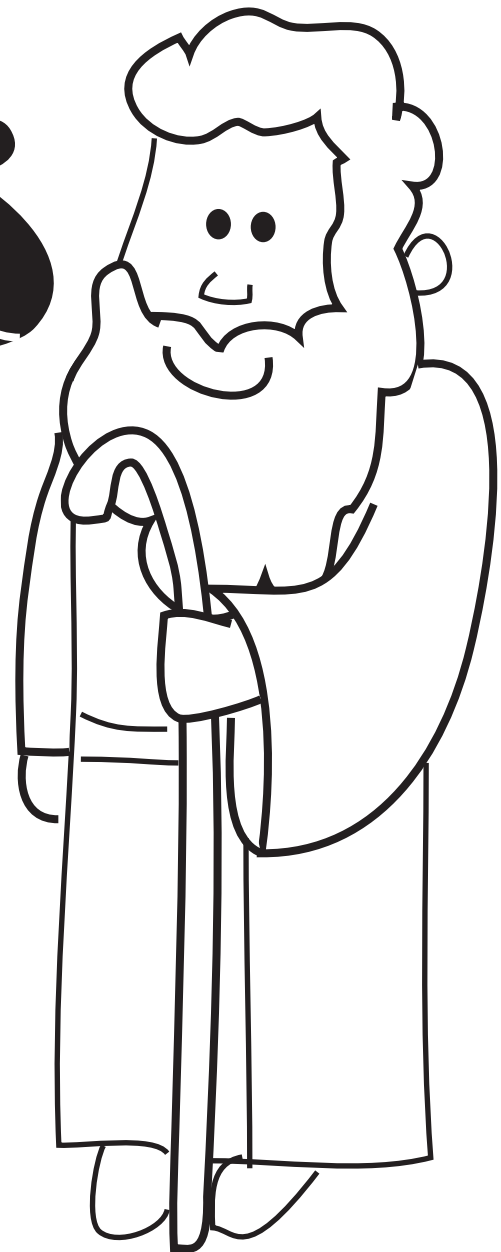
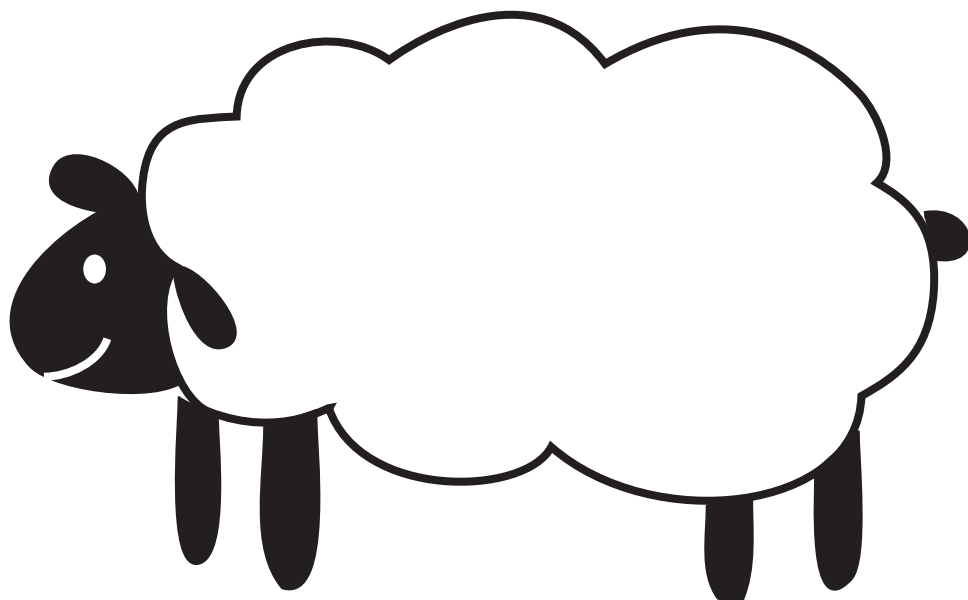
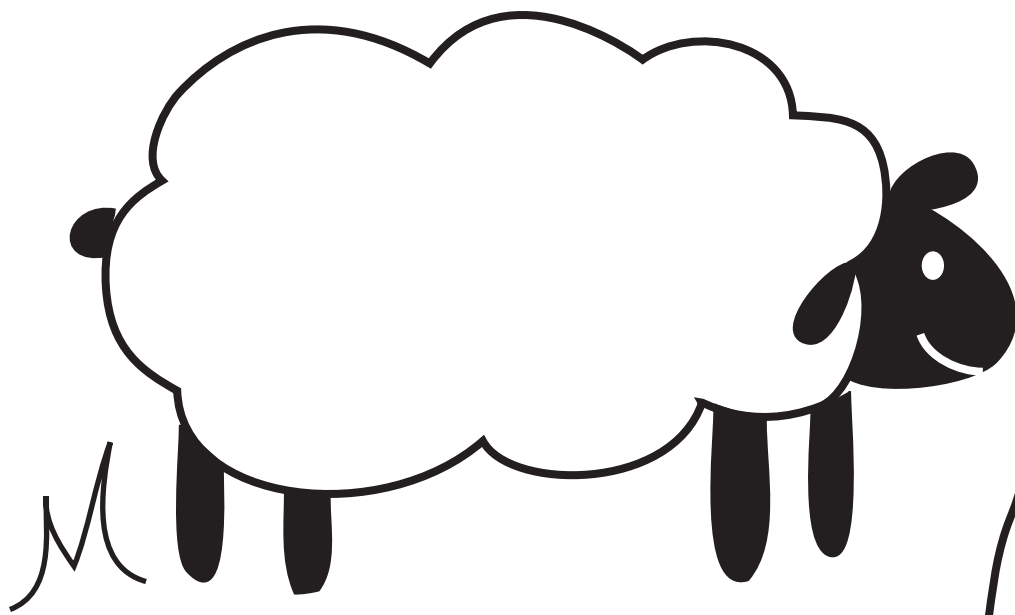
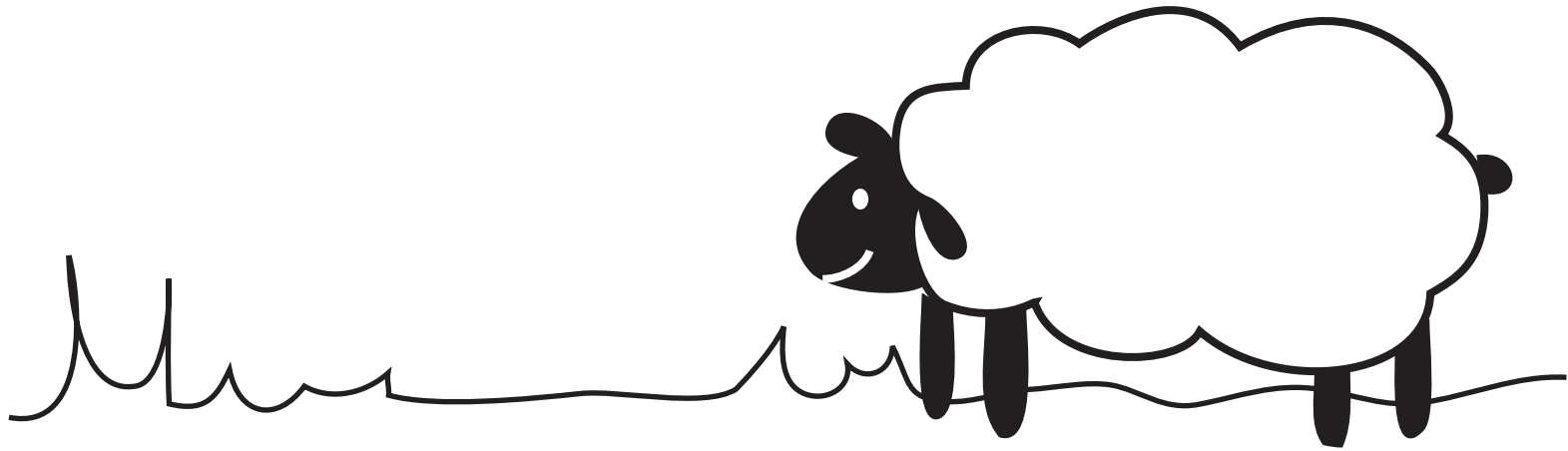


This week's crepe challenge

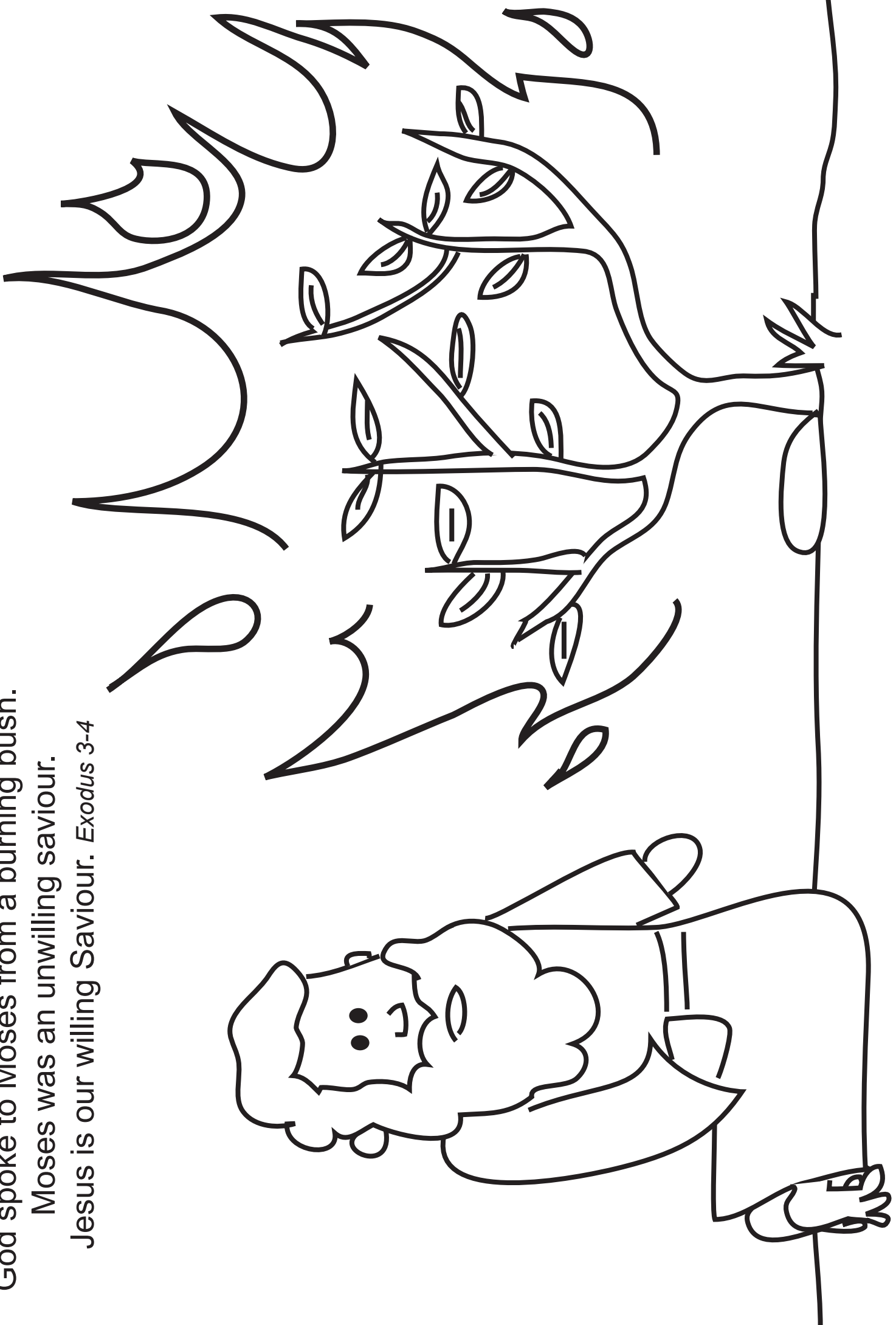

Crêpe comes from the Latin word *crispa*, which means curled. Crêpes are originally from Brittany, a region in France, but they are enjoyed all over the world. Here's an easy crêpe recipe for you to try at home! Ask an adult for help with the stove.

RECIPE:

You will need:

- 2 cups milk
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/4 tsp sugar



Method:

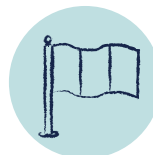
1. Whisk wet ingredients together until combined. Add dry ingredients while whisking until smooth.
2. Leave the mixture to rest for 30 minutes.
3. Heat frying pan to a medium-high heat. Coat with butter.
4. Pour just enough mixture into the hot pan so that it thinly covers the base. Cook until golden and repeat with the rest of the mixture.
5. Serve with nutella, banana, strawberries and nuts or other sweet and savoury toppings of your choice.
