#### Read the bible and discuss:

### Youth:

- 1. Read Mark 2:23-3:35. See how many people or groups you can name, and how they respond to Jesus.
- 2. Which of these responses are good, and which of these are bad? Why?
- 3. Why do you think the different people responded the way they did?
- 4. Where in the passage does Jesus say what the right way to respond to Him is? (Hint: it's near the end)
- 5. When do we find it hard to respond to Jesus the right way?


### Kids:

- 1. How did the Pharisees in our story feel about Jesus?
- 2. When Jesus told the man with the shrivelled hand to stand up, what do you think everyone was expecting to happen next?
- 3. What did Jesus ask the Pharisees about the rest day? And how did they respond?
- 4. Next, Jesus healed the man with the shrivelled hand! How did the Pharisees react?
- 5. Do we ever react to Jesus the wrong way?

**Pray:** thank God for sending Jesus who saves! Ask God that He would help us react the right way to Jesus – to listen to Him and do what He says.

**Bonus family discussion question:** what does Mark 3:35 mean, and what does it look like to do it?


